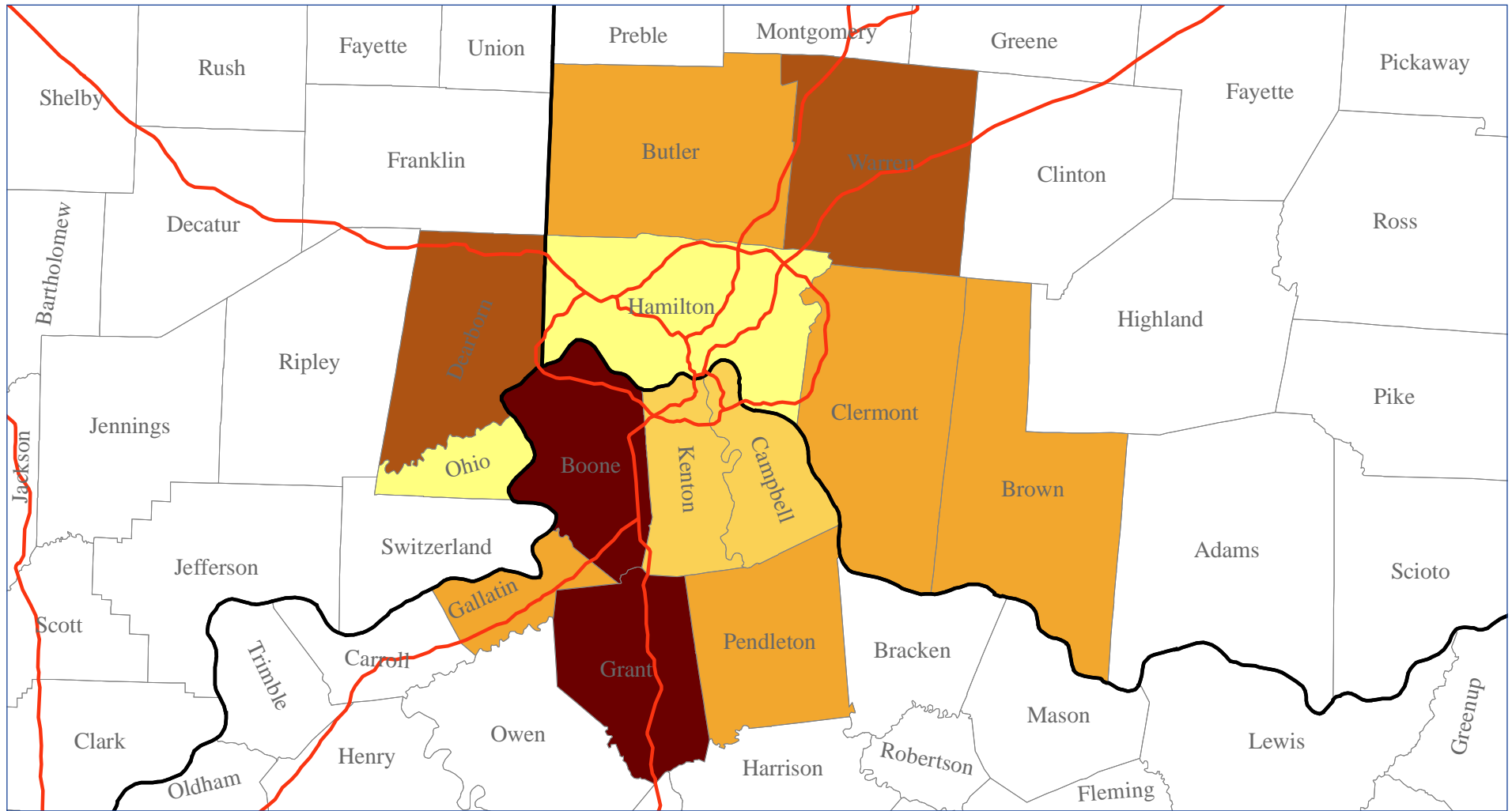


1995 Population Change



What it is: This indicator shows the population for a given year minus the population for the immediately preceding year divided by the population for the immediately preceding year and multiplied by 100.

Why it matters: Population change reflects the economic and social capital growth and health of the community. Regions with growing populations often can attract more federal and state revenues and often have stronger labor and retail markets and greater local tax revenues.
